



Earning Our Accreditation

Back to school takes on a whole new meaning for our School at Spaulding this fall. Our school is currently undergoing the program and compliance monitoring review with the Department of Education's Bureau of Special Education. Required of any private provider of special education programs, the accreditation process is extremely thorough and vigorous, lasting one entire calendar year. The primary focus of the monitoring review is to improve educational outcomes for all children with disabilities and all special education programs must



complete the review prior to serving students. In 2010 and 2015, Spaulding earned 5-year accreditation, which is the maximum length available, and we are working toward another exemplary review.

As part of the process, school administrators have submitted the policy and procedure manual, updated curricula for all subjects in grades Kindergarten through 12, information regarding staff certifications, and other supportive materials. Next month, all faculty will complete a training in the self-assessment process in preparation for the onsite program approval and compliance monitoring in early 2020. The onsite review is focused on an indepth examination of student files to ensure Spaulding Youth Center is compliant and has implemented the special education policies and procedures. The goal is to demonstrate compliance not just during the monitoring process but for throughout the accreditation period.

"As we progress through the accreditation process, I am once again impressed with the professionalism and commitment of our school staff," said Colleen Sliva, School Principal & Special Education Director. "Their dedication and compassion for our students is demonstrated through their continued diligence to document, update and maintain each child's developments in order to continue to tailor the student's educational approach. We look forward to earning another 5-year accreditation and demonstrating the level of excellence we strive to achieve every day."

In late spring, our board and executive leadership team kicked off a new initiative to closely examine our name and brand to determine if these components still accurately represent who we are as well as those we serve. Established in 1871 and known as Spaulding Youth Center since 1958, we have adapted to the needs of those we serve for nearly 150 years. In fact, during the past two decades, Spaulding has expanded our offerings to reach new populations of children and families who need our help.

In 1998, we opened our Cutter-Wiggins Trauma Unit to provide specialized care for those children who came to us with significant trauma, abuse or neglect. By becoming a Child Placing Agency for Individual Service Option (ISO) foster care in 2004, Spaulding continued to expand services for these children who required intensive therapy to heal and then help them experience success in a family unit. We also license and train loving foster families for children who need them. The changing needs of today's children and youth have evolved to include more therapeutic opportunities for the entire family unit, which can produce more effective and positive outcomes for generations to come. Our newest endeavor is becoming a FAST Forward provider of clinical services to families at risk before they become part of the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) system. These services are provided through our clinical services and community-based programs.

We are excited to evaluate whether our current programs are adequately represented by our current name and brand as well as to explore how to best communicate all that we offer to reach those who need us most. Stay tuned for more details on this self-evaluation process in the coming months as we prepare to unveil the new name and brand which will best represent the comprehensive services delivered each and every day by our caring and dedicated staff on our peaceful and therapeutic campus and in the community. We are proud of our history and look forward to our future as an important provider of services in New Hampshire.
