Medication	Used for:
Acetaminophen every 4-6hr (dose weight based)	Pain, fever >100 degrees
Ibuprofen every 6-8hr (dose weight based)	
Diphenhydramine 25-50 mg p.o. every 4-6 hours	Allergic reaction/hives , dystonia
Nasal saline spray 2-3 times per day	Nasal congestion, dryness
Triple antibiotic ointment topically	Infection/to prevent infection, burns
Cough Drops as needed	Sore throat/cough
Sunblock SPF 30	Sunburns/prevention
Hydrocortisone cream 1% topically 2x/day	Itch/ bug bites,
Caladryl gel topically 2-3x/day	Bee sting, poison ivy, allergic reactions
Normal saline or Hydrogen Peroxide 3%	Topically to cuts/ abrasions prn
Tolnaftate 1% fungal cream 2x/day	Athlete's foot, other fungal infections
Lice Shampoo	Use as directed
Fiber Gummy , 1 gummy by mouth up to 3 times a day	constipation
Tums 650 mg 1 hour after meals up to 4x /day	Heartburn
Epinephrine 0.15-0.3mg for anaphylaxis. Repeat injection in 5	for anaphylaxis resulting from bee sting or other allergen
minutes if first dose not effective. (dose weight based)	
EMLA cream	Numbing cream for injections or blood withdrawal
Phenylephrine 5-10mg every 4 hours (only students >80 lbs)	Nasal congestion (if no seizure history)
Guaifenesin Cough, 1-2 tsp every 4 hours (only students >80lbs)	Cough/expectorant
Carbamoxide ear drops 2-4 drops in affected ear 3x/day for 7 days	Excess ear wax

GENERAL:

- Lab Protocol: Baseline labs will be drawn on all students. Monitoring of medication blood levels will be done at required intervals, and follow-up for any abnormal values will be drawn as needed.
- Immunizations: Given according to the CDC guidelines and New Hampshire School Immunization Guidelines with parental consent.
- Annual EKG's: Performed on every child annually.

- **Dystonia Protocol:** Any child that receives an anti-psychotic are at risk for EPS (Extra Pyramidal Symptoms). To assess for any adverse reactions, a licensed member from Health Services will do an AIMS/DISCUS assessment every three months.
- Ophthalmology Protocol: Any child that receives the anti-psychotic, Seroquel, will have a slit-exam evaluation annually.
- Vision Screening Protocol: To be done annually by The Lions Club.
- Audiology Protocol: To be provided by Spaulding annually.
