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Canterbury Shaker Village offers tours of the past, wisdom for the future

CANTERBURY — While people often look toward the future, Canterbury Shaker Village's guided daily tours offer insights into the past that are relevant today.

"The Shaker's reputation for health, manual labor, and devotion stems from the belief that all work is a form of prayer and an act of worship," explained Lead Tour Guide Dick Demark. "That simple belief provided a system of analysis, planning, and quality control that has yet to be equaled."

According to Linda Nolan, executive director of the Village, their "system" of beliefs "shook" their community in the 18th and 19th century America.

"They challenged almost every basic



stream line of human needs during their lives," she said. "Shakers believed in communal ownership, sharing in the process of planning, working, equality of the sexes, self-reliance, and living simply."

Shakers also believed in the religious process of dancing as a spiritual relationship with God, which was a powerful symbol of their cultural belief system, added Nolan.
