SPAULDING ACADEMY'S EXPANSION IS UNDERWAY

Spaulding Academy is growing, thanks to the support of Spaulding's Board of Directors and leadership team who have spearheaded the project. The addition of 15,000 square feet to the existing Academy building has begun – which will significantly expand the size of the school.

The project will provide students and staff with two more classrooms, a technology wing, conference rooms, offices, and treatment rooms. The dining hall and kitchen will also move from Westwood Hall to Spaulding Academy, offering students more convenient access to meals while at school.

The addition was designed by the same architectural committee that designed the school – Banwell Architects, of Lebanon, NH. Excavation and site work began in September with Eckman Construction of Bedford, NH, and Londonderry's Wilcox and Barton civil engineers overseeing the project.

"The Spaulding Academy addition is critical to maintaining our educational and care standards of excellence," says Todd Emmons, CEO & President. "I am excited for this project, and hope that the students and staff across campus will enjoy watching Spaulding grow – again."

Project completion is expected in early summer 2023.

DENNIS GALIMBERTI: Protecting Freedom, Supporting Spaulding

Spaulding's Director of Support Services, Dennis Galimberti, is a member of the U.S. Army National Guard currently serving his fourth year-long deployment. He is working remotely with Project Manager Tyler Rozen to oversee infrastructure projects underway – and planned for the coming months – on campus. These include:

- Adaptive playground site work has begun, and playground equipment will be installed in the spring.
- Spaulding Academy addition the septic system installation and foundation work has started, and construction is expected to take one year.
- Cutter-Wiggins Cottage renovation the upper floor will soon be renovated to create new office space.
- Residential Cottage upgrades this fall, every cottage will be updated, from vinyl siding installation to roof and window replacements.
- Westwood Hall construction is scheduled to begin this winter to convert the dining hall and kitchen into 18 offices, a conference room, and ancillary space.

Spaulding is grateful to Dennis for both his dedication to our country and his willingness to support the organization during his active-duty deployment.

ECHOVANTAGE WILL REVOLUTIONIZE CAMPUS DATA MANAGEMENT

Spaulding is excited to announce its adoption of a highly integrated and intuitive behavioral health record management system. Starting in mid-November, all clinical medical, billing, incident reporting, and admissions data for each child will be accessible on a single platform in EchoVantage. This secure and streamlined system is designed specifically for behavioral health and will eliminate the need for the three separate databases currently used on campus for documentation management.

"Transitioning to this system provides so many benefits, especially the ability to view, use, and share real time, accurate data," says Amanda Champagne, Executive Director of Family Services. "The depth and quality of its functionality surpasses what currently exists in the industry."

Thanks to the talent and commitment of Spaulding staff members – especially Digital Learning Specialist Charley Suter, who wrote SQL databases and built reports to tailor EchoVantage to Spaulding's requirements, and Quality Improvement Coordinator Carol Sanborn, who is leading administrative training in the system – employees, parents, and foster families will have the opportunity to access information more efficiently.

All data for past and current students will be imported into EchoVantage and ChartMeds, the student electronic medication administration record (EMAR) program, will interface with it. EchoVantage will be used across all of Spaulding's

programs, including Residential, Academic, Community-Based, and ISO Foster Care.

EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT: Arthur Greenwood Ensures Campuswide Safety Every Day

As a father of four and grandfather of seven, Arthur "Art" Greenwood takes his role as Safety Coordinator on the Support Services team very seriously. He is responsible for every aspect of campus safety and is celebrating ten years at Spaulding.

Each day, Art conducts a Life Safety audit of Spaulding's 14 buildings to ensure all exits are clear and that emergency lights, fire alarm pulls, and fire sprinklers are operable. He inspects the playgrounds and holds 14 fire drills every month, manages four non-fire emergency drills (active shooter/bomb threat, utility failure, medical response, and HAZMAT) and conducts two food safety audits annually.

Art carefully develops and maintains Spaulding's emergency, security, and safety plans and coordinates inspections required by the NH Departments of Education and Labor, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, and Tilton-Northfield Fire Department. He also tracks work orders for necessary repairs, facilitates two committees, and organizes fire extinguisher trainings and kitchen fire suppression inspections.

Art credits his previous decades-long management career with Hannaford, along with his passion for organization, with his success. "It's a group effort to have successful safety inspections," he says. "I love interacting with the kids and staff. It's a rewarding job."

ADAPTIVE PLAYGROUND IN PROGRESS

Fun times and happy, lifelong memories are on the horizon with Spaulding's adaptive playground! The 10,308 square foot playground is currently being constructed – and will soon be one of New England's largest adaptive playgrounds

Sitework began in September, which included subsurface creation. The large inventory of adaptive playground equipment will arrive later this fall, and installation will take place in the spring to protect the pieces from the harsh winter elements. The staff and children are excited for the playground's spring unveiling.
