EARLY SUCCESS WITH SPAULDING'S NEW PERMANENCY TEAM

The Permanency Team for Spaulding Academy and Family Services officially launched in March after a year in development and is already showing success.

Consisting of permanency specialists Cheryl Consoletti and Ashley Fenimore, the Permanency Team's focus is to provide wrap-around support for youth from the start of admissions to up to six months after discharge to enable the youth to have long-term success. Our permanency specialists work collaboratively with the child, their family, healthcare providers, community resources, the school administrative unit (SAU), and state departments, such as the NH Division for Children Youth and Families, Child Protection, and Juvenile Justice to ensure the child has access to the appropriate services and support throughout treatment and after discharge.

This dynamic team works to identify and fulfill the needs of the child and their family,

whether it becomes reunification, foster home placement, rebuilding family systems, overcoming skill deficits, or simply providing information and connections to assist the transition. Ashley and Cheryl are each familiar with every residential student and many of the youth will become familiar with both specialists as well, to support permanency-driven treatment as a team effort.

Prior to the Permanency Team, kids only had 30 days of aftercare from various case managers when they left the program, and the readmission rate was quite high. Now, once a child is discharged, Ashley and Cheryl work as liaisons to bridge services and are on call for questions, offer clarification to on-campus experiences, and more, for up to six months.

Each case offers a different level of engagement and involvement. A youth's transition is softer with this program because now there is preplanning to set the youth up for success as they return to their families, communities, and schools. Each child's permanency plan remains at the forefront throughout enrollment, and we collect and analyze data to measure the success of the initiative, which is already happening.

Cheryl shares, "We've seen one successful adoption already; another is planned for June. Both cases had six months of aftercare! We've closed 9 of 10 cases successfully in this short time as well."

EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT: Jason Sterner

Jason Sterner is a long-time friendly face and enthusiastic advocate of adventure-based learning whether throughout our 500+-acre campus or in surrounding areas. In fact, he celebrated 25 years this year, with 23 years of these as the Outdoor Education Coordinator of the Experiential Challenges Outdoors (EChO) program at Spaulding Academy. EChO provides students the chance to learn to take positive risks and embrace challenges with outside activities. An important part of EChO is cutting-edge adaptive equipment so each child can access the same lessons as their peers.

Over the past 25 years, Jason has grown our EChO program significantly, including adding exciting new programs and features to challenge our students. A few of Jason's favorite projects include an enormous high ropes course set in large poles in one of our beautiful fields, a low-ropes and canopy course, a video series that involves staff and students in spoofs of "Man vs. Wild" and the 7-mile public multi-use trail network built in 2013 for mountain bikers and hikers. Coming this summer are a nature-based playground, a small mountain bike flow trail added to our skill park, and a universally accessible tree house to enable students with mobility issues to share in the joy of 'climbing.'

Spaulding students benefit from Jason's experience as a rock and ice-climbing guide for EMS and as an adjunct professor for his alma mater, Plymouth State University, where he earned his M.Ed. in Adventure Education. Over the years, Jason has earned multiple certifications to round out his already impressive resume as well as to offer more opportunities, such as paddleboarding, to the children in his classes.
